General Surgery Services in North Wales – Your Views Matter

Introduction

The Health Board has been looking at how we provide non-elective general surgical services in North Wales – that is, where support is needed within a few hours or a few days of someone becoming ill. We want to improve the care provided to service users, so people have access to safe and effective services.

Why are we doing this now?

Analysis shows that trying to maintain the status quo is not in the best interest of the people of North Wales and we need to address this. We face a number of challenges in meeting quality

standards. This is not unique to us, but can be more difficult given our geography. We need a resilient and sustainable workforce that can provide the care they want to and not be spread too thinly. The risk is too great for us all if we cannot address this.

What next?

We wish to invite service users, carers and the local community to an event where we can share our findings with you and hear your views on what services could look like in the future.
